



2022 Junior and Senior Pan American Championships Selection Procedures

Amended 6/14/22

1.0 Introduction

The purpose of this document is to outline the process that will be used by the Women’s Athlete Selection Committee of USA Gymnastics to nominate athletes to the 2022 Junior and Senior Pan American Championships taking place July 15-17, 2022 in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil.

1.1 Objectives

The objective of these processes and procedures are to nominate the best possible delegation who will be capable of achieving the following targets:

- Finish 1-3 in the Team competition.
- Finish 1-3 in the All-Around competition.

1.2 Delegation Size and Financial Considerations

The maximum number of athletes in the Junior delegation is four (4) plus one (1) traveling replacement athlete. The maximum number of athletes in the Senior delegation is five (5) plus one (1) traveling replacement athlete. Maximum of two (2) athletes per country in All Around and Apparatus Finals.

The U.S. WAG delegation will be composed of:

- 4 Junior athletes plus 1 traveling replacement athlete
- Up to 5 Junior personal coaches
- 5 Senior athletes plus 1 traveling replacement athlete
- Up to 6 Senior personal coaches
- 1 team leader
- 2 medical staff
- 1 security officer

Participation is fully funded by USA Gymnastics/the LOC for the delegation.

2.0 Eligibility

Athletes are eligible for selection to the Team provided that:

- they are a national of the United States at the time of selection and hold a valid U.S. passport that will not expire for six months after the conclusion of the Championships.
- Junior athletes are 14-15 years old in 2022 (born in 2007 or 2008).
- Senior athletes are 16 years old or older in 2022 (born 2006 or earlier).
- they are a current National Team athlete and have signed the NT Agreement.
- they hold a valid FIG License that does not expire before the end of the 2022 Junior/Senior Pan American Championships.
- they are a member in good standing with USA Gymnastics
- they are USADA/WADA compliant

3.0 Athlete Selection

The four (4) members of the 2022 Junior Pan Am Championships team as well as one (1) traveling replacement athlete and the five (5) members of the 2022 Senior Pan Am Championships team as well as one (1) traveling replacement athlete will be named by the Women's Athlete Selection Committee as follows:

- Provide the event names, dates and locations of all trials, events and camps to be used as part of the selection process.
 - 2022 Junior/Senior Pan American Games Selection Event – July 3-6, 2022 – Katy, TX.
- Provide event names, dates, locations and description of how athletes are eligible **to be invited** to the selection event, events and camps listed above.

The following athletes are eligible **to be invited by the Athlete Selection Committee** to the 2022 Junior/Senior Pan American Championships Selection Event:

- All age-eligible Junior Elite athletes, 14-15 years old in 2022 (born in 2007 or 2008), and all age-eligible Senior Elite athletes, 16 years old or older in 2022 (born in 2006 or earlier), that qualified to the 2021 U.S. Championships, Fort Worth, TX by score or approved petition.
- All age-eligible Junior Elite athletes, 14-15 years old in 2022 (born in 2007 or 2008), who achieve a minimum All-Around score of 49.50 and all age-eligible Senior Elite athletes who achieve a minimum All-Around score of 50.50 at:
 - Winter Cup – February 24-27, 2022 – Frisco, TX.

OR

- All age-eligible Junior Elite athletes, 14-15 years old in 2022 (born in 2007 or 2008) who achieve a minimum All-Around score of 49.50 and all age-eligible Senior Elite athletes who

achieve a minimum All-Around score of 50.50 at any one of the selected 2022 Women's National Elite Qualifiers listed below:

- 2022 Vegas Cup National Elite Qualifier – Jan. 21-23, 2022 – Las Vegas, NV.
- 2022 All American National Elite Qualifier – Jan. 28-30, 2022 – Puyallup, WA.
- 2022 Buckeye Classic National Elite Qualifier – Feb. 4-6, 2022 – Columbus, OH.
- 2022 Dragon Invitational National Elite Qualifier – Feb. 11-13, 2022 – Blue Springs, MO.
- 2022 Metroplex Challenge National Elite Qualifier – Feb. 18-20, 2022 – Fort Worth, TX.
- 2022 KPAC Cup National Elite Qualifier – March 11-13, 2022 – Winston Salem, NC.
- 2022 Stars National Elite Qualifier – April 9, 2022 – Katy, TX.
- 2022 Parkettes National Elite Qualifier – June 10-12, 2022 – Allentown, PA

OR

- All age-eligible Junior Elite athletes, 14-15 years old in 2022 (born in 2007 or 2008) who achieve a minimum All-Around score of 49.50 and all age-eligible Senior Elite athletes who achieve a minimum All-Around score of 50.50 at any one of the selected 2022 High Performance Camps, listed below (full routines on competition surfaces):
 - National Team Training Camp – March 31 – April 3, 2022 – Katy, TX.
 - Elite Development Training Camp – May 19-22, 2021 – Katy, TX. (judged utilizing USA Junior Elite rules, full routines on competitive surfaces.)
 - National Team Training Camp – June 2-5, 2022 – Katy, TX.
 - Elite Development Training Camp – June 12-15, 2022 – Katy, TX.
 - ~~Elite Development Invite Training Camp – June 16-19, 2022 – Katy, TX. (judged utilizing USA Junior Elite rules, full routines on competitive surfaces.)~~
- Provide a comprehensive, step-by-step description of the method that explains how athletes will go through the selection process (include maximum Team size).
 - The Junior/Senior Pan American Championships Selection Event will be used to select team members for the 2022 Junior/Senior Pan American Championships Team.
 - The Junior/Senior Pan American Championships Selection Event will have a two-day competition. Day one, athletes compete in the AA and day two, athletes compete on a minimum of one event.
 - The highest scoring All-Around gymnast in each age division at the conclusion of Day 1 of the Junior/Senior Pan American Championships Selection Event will automatically qualify to the four (4) member Junior Pan American Championships team or the five (5) member Senior Pan American Championships team.
 - Using the discretionary selection criteria listed in 3.1, the Athlete Selection Committee will name the remaining three (3) members of the 2022 Junior Pan American Championships Team and the remaining four (4) members of the 2022 Senior Pan American Championships Team at the conclusion of Day 2 of the Junior/Senior Pan American Championships Selection Event.
 - The Athlete Selection Committee may also name at least one (1) Junior and at least one (1) Senior traveling replacement athlete using the discretionary selection criteria listed in 3.1.
 - The final line-up determination will be announced a minimum of 24 hours prior to Qualifications (Competition I). This determination will be made by the High-Performance Director or Team Leader, in consultation with credentialed coaching staff.

- If there is not a High-Performance Director, a Team Leader will be named by the International Elite Committee and perform this function.

3.1 Criteria, data, and results considered by the Athlete Selection Committee

- Team needs and medal potential, any domestic and international performance and experience from 2019 - 2021 including type, frequency, routine hit percentage and caliber of the event(s).
- Composite strength of all the 2022 Junior/Senior Pan American Championships Team Members.
- Start values (D Score) on each apparatus of all potential team members achieved at any national competition or High Performance Camp in 2022 listed in 3.0.
- Execution (E Score) on each apparatus of all potential team members achieved at any national competition or High-Performance Camp in 2022 listed in 3.0.
- Consistency (percentage of hit routines) shown by the gymnast at any national competition or High-Performance Camp in 2022 listed in 3.0.
 - A hit routine is defined as a routine that does not include a large deduction or greater (as defined in the FIG Code of Points) on any single skill within the routine.
- World Class presentation – the strength, endurance, technical execution standard and artistic components commensurate with World and Olympic presentation.
- Physical capability to fulfill the training plan as directed by the High Performance Team or Team Leader.
- Demonstrated professional attitude and ability to positively contribute to the team dynamic.

Team members should expect to follow the verification plan laid out and communicated by the Women’s High Performance Team or Team Leader following the Junior/Senior Pan American Championships Selection Event.

3.2 Coach Selection

- One (1) Head Coach and one (1) Assistant Coach for the 2022 Junior Pan American Championships Team and One (1) Head Coach and one (1) Assistant Coach for the 2022 Senior Pan American Championships Team will be selected from among the personal coaches of the team members, after the final Team Selection based upon the following criteria:
 - Proven team leadership ability
 - International experience
 - Professional membership in good standing
 - Attendance at required meetings
- Per FIG technical regulations, either the Head Coach or Assistant Coach must be female.

3.3 Delegation Requirements

All USA Gymnastics Staff (coaches, team leaders, medical) must adhere to the following requirements:

- Successfully pass the National Center for Safety Initiatives’ (NCSI) background screen in accordance with the current USA Gymnastics Background Check Policy prior to nomination.
 - Should a nominee experience any event between the time the background check is conducted and the relevant Games that may change his/her background check status, the nominee must inform USA Gymnastics.
- Possess a valid passport that does not expire until at least six months after the conclusion of the 2022 Pan American Championships.

- Have the ability to work effectively with the LOC (local organizing committee).
- Have strong administrative, communication and organizational capabilities/skills *(if applicable)*.
- Be responsible for Team's adherence to all rules regarding discipline at the Championships *(if applicable)*.
- Fulfill all duties and requirements of the LOC including attendance at required meetings *(if applicable)*.
- Be available for entire duration of the Championships *(if applicable)*.
- Have USA Gymnastics approval to make financial decisions regarding the Team *(if applicable)*.
- Possess high level, specific technical and tactical knowledge of the sport *(if applicable)*.
- Have thorough knowledge and understanding of the FIG rules and regulations governing the sport *(if applicable)*.
- Demonstrate ability to establish harmonious relationships with athletes and other Team personnel.
- Be in good health and able to withstand the physical rigors of traveling with and working with the Team.
- Must have successfully completed all registration requirements by stated deadline.
- Participate in USADA training as required for position *(if applicable)*.
- Be a USA Gymnastics Member in good standing.
- Successfully complete the USOPC's Safe Sport awareness training and education program.

In the event the Coach role is combined with the Team Leader function, that individual must fulfill the Team Leader responsibilities, as applicable.

3.4 Determination of athletes' competitive apparatus and start order

The competitive order and strategy will be determined by the Women's High Performance Team or Team Leader, in cooperation with the personal coaches. As per FIG regulations, the order of competition on each event shall be submitted no later than 24 hours prior to the competition.

4.0 Petition Procedures and Requirements

Petitions to the 2022 Junior/Senior Pan American Championships Selection Event may be submitted to the Women's Athlete Selection Committee by any-eligible current junior or senior elite athlete who was unable to attend 2021 U.S. Championships due to injury, illness, or extenuating circumstance. In order for petitions to be considered they must be submitted by midnight EST, Wednesday, June 29, 2022, and the following must be included:

- Completed petition form found here: <https://usagym.org/PDFs/Forms/Women/injury2019.pdf>
- Documentation from medical staff in the event of injury/illness or documentation from the athlete/coach outlining why the athlete was unable to compete at U.S. Championships in the event of extenuating circumstance
- Letter of recommendation from the athlete's coach, which includes past results or data to support naming the athlete to the Junior/Senior Pan American Championships team.

The following factors may be reviewed by the Athlete Selection Committee when considering submitted petitions:

- D scores, E scores, and overall performance from major domestic and international competitions from 2021-2022 as well as routine videos submitted to the Elite Development Program Coordinator or High Performance Director/Team in 2021-2022.

- Contributions to the team score potential based off final scores from major domestic and international competitions from 2021-2022 and routine videos submitted to the Elite Development Program Coordinator or High Performance Director/Team in 2021-2022.

5.0 Removal of Athletes and Staff

USA Gymnastics has jurisdiction over potential nominees. An athlete or staff member who is to be nominated to the Team by USA Gymnastics may be removed as a nominee for any of the following reasons, as determined by USA Gymnastics:

- Voluntary withdrawal. Team member must submit a written letter to the Vice President of Women's Program of USA Gymnastics.
- Injury or illness which inhibits peak performance as certified by a physician's statement, subject to verification by USA Gymnastics Medical Staff. If a team member refuses verification of his/her illness or injury, his/her injury will be assumed to be disabling and he/she may be removed.
- Violation of Women's Program National Team Agreement.
- Inability to perform the duties required (staff).
- Violation of USA Gymnastics Safe Sport Policy:

An athlete may be removed as a nominee to the Team or from the Team for an adjudicated violation of IOC, PASO, IPC, WADA, FIG, USADA and/or USOPC anti-doping protocol, policies and procedures, as applicable.

A team member who is removed from the Team pursuant to this provision has the right to a hearing per USA Gymnastics' [grievance process](#) and the USOPC's Bylaws, Section 9.

6.0 Athlete Replacement

Following the athlete selection, the following conditions must be met up until the deadline for official submission of the Pan Am Championships starting order:

- the athlete is still eligible; and
- the athlete is healthy and able to compete as verified by a member of the USAG medical team, and
- the athlete is performing at the level that warranted their nomination to the team.

If based on the above, an athlete cannot participate in a competition due to injury or other unforeseen circumstance then the Women's High Performance Director or Team Leader, in consultation with the personal coaches, the USAG medical staff, and the Women's Vice President of Program, will determine if a substitute or reserve member of the team should replace that athlete.

6.1 Coach Replacement

In the event the a coach is unable to perform the duties of the position(s) for injury, illness, Code of Conduct violation or any other unforeseen circumstances that would result in the need to replace him/her, the replacement candidate must meet all of the applicable criteria listed Section 3.1 above.

- If time permits, and it is deemed to be beneficial for the team, a change will be made to the official coaching staff.

7.0 Anti-Doping Requirements

Athletes must adhere to all IOC, PASO, WADA, FIG, USADA and USOPC anti-doping protocols, policies and procedures, as applicable. This includes participation in Out-of-Competition Testing as required by the IOC, PASO, WADA, FIG, USADA and USOPC Rules, as applicable.

8.0 Announcement of Selection of Athletes and Coaches

The official announcement of team selection is the responsibility of USA Gymnastics and will be announced at the conclusion of the Junior/Senior Pan American Championships Selection Event. All internal verbal or written communication to athletes, coaches, or member associations regarding team selection is considered an “*unofficial notice*” and is NOT for public distribution. Official notice of team selection occurs when USAG provides a formal public “release” announcing the team selection, or when USAG partners with a multi-sport organization to formally announce a team.

10.0 International Disclaimer

These procedures are based on IOC, PASO, as applicable, and/or FIG rules and regulations as presently known and understood. Any change in the selection procedures caused by a change in IOC, PASO, as applicable, and/or FIG rules and regulations will be distributed to the affected athletes immediately. The selection criteria are based on the latest information available to USA Gymnastics. However, the selections are always subject to unforeseen, intervening circumstances, and realistically may not have accounted for every possible contingency.

If any force of nature, or force majeure, should cause the alteration or cancellation of any of the selection events listed in this document, these selection procedures will be revised by the International Elite Committee.
